Education system in Greece

The Greek Education System is divided into Three Levels :

- Primary
- Secondary and
- Tertiary

The general responsibility for education lies with the "Ministry of Education, Research and Religious Affairs"

Primary education

Kindergarden (4 – 6 years old) and Primary school (6 – 12 years old)

Secondary education

Gymnasium (12-15) years old translated as Junior high School or Lower Secondary School, o compulsory three year school

Higher Tertiary education

Universities, Polytechnics, Technological Educational Institutes (TEI)

Our Lessons in High School:


Modern and Ancient Greek Language, Maths,

It comprises two parallel sectors:

Helps pupils


To become free, responsible and democratic citizens
